## OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMS

## LENDING CLOSET

The Lending Closet provides surplus durable medical equipment and supplies to those in Palm Beach County who need it the most. The Lending Closet welcomes donations of new and gently used medical equipment including wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs and so much more. We then clean.



refurbish and repurpose the equipment making it available to those who would otherwise be unable to secure items for themselves. We also accept unopened, unused supplies such as wound care and incontinence items.

Thanks to the support of so many, in 2021 the Clinics Can Help Lending Closet received and distributed medical equipment and supplies valued at over \$2,100,000.

## KINDER PROJECT

The Kinder (Kids In Need of Durable Equipment Right now) Project provides adaptive durable medical equipment and supplies at no cost for families with children with special needs. These items are vital for providing mobility, independence, and the opportunity for children



to live their best lives. Monies from the annual Clinics Can Help Golf Classic, along with specific grants and donations, support the KINDER Project.

## **C.R.I.B.S PROJECT** (Cribs R for Infant Baby Safety)

Initiated in 2010 with just 77 Pack 'N Play cribs, CCH launched its first crib giveaway to help families provide a safe sleep environment for newborns or infants. A decade later, and now

in collaboration with local nonprofits that serve women and children, we safely distribute over 500 cribs to families in need annually. Generous grants from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, as well as gifts from individuals, make this program possible with a greater reach every year.
