

- Supported 2,563 adults with essential medical equipment and supplies they couldn't afford on their own. • Completed 7,040 client visits, providing \$2.7 million worth of medical equipment and supplies.

We are proud to serve many diverse communities throughout Palm Beach County and beyond, working with an extensive network of partners including free clinics, local hospitals, and more than 20 medical agencies in Palm Beach County alone.

Quality Control Survey 2023:

- 98% of clients were satisfied with the equipment they received
- 100% said the medical equipment improved their quality of life
- 88% would not have been able to afford the equipment on their own
